Fred Meyer Non-Food workers deserve respect, fair wages and hours, a protected health plan, and a secure pension. For the first time, we are fighting for this standing shoulder to shoulder as Fred Meyer Non-Food workers from Albany, Coos Bay, Corvallis, Longview, Newberg, Portland, Salem, and The Dalles.

We have been fighting for respect from Fred Meyer management for years. Our focus is about what is fair. We work for one employer, we are one union - we deserve a contract that is fair and equitable no matter where you live.

United Across the Northwest.

UFCW 555 has been in close and consistent communication with UFCW 21 in Seattle and UFCW International Union leadership in Washington, DC. We are building our strength by coordinating Fred Meyer Non-Food workers up and down the I-5 corridor from Bellingham to Southern Oregon.

Common Problems. Common Solutions.

UFCW 555 and UFCW 21 are facing similar problems with Fred Meyer. "If Fred Meyer thinks that they can just cut our hours, threaten our rights, or propose to jack up our health costs, they should think again," said Dan Clay, President UFCW Local 555.

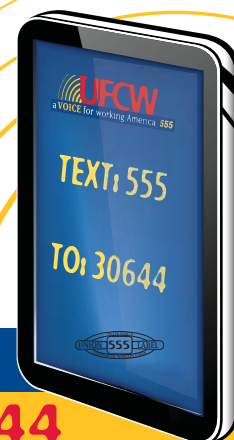
Both unions have contracts expiring in the end of June. By standing united at the bargaining table with other grocery store workers and by acting across state lines we are more powerful.
