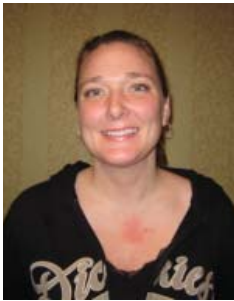


Bargaining Session
